Information We May Collect

In running and maintaining our website we may collect and process the following data about you:

Information about your use of our site including details of your visits such as pages viewed and the resources that you access. Such information includes traffic data, location data and other communication data including internet protocol (IP) address, [your login data – if website visitors create/use an account], browser type and

version, time zone setting and location, browser plug-in types and versions, operating system and platform, and other technology on the devices you use to access this website.

- Information provided voluntarily by you. For example, when you register for information or make an application (including name, username or similar identifier, title, and gender)
- Information that you provide when you communicate with us by any means (including email address and telephone number)
- Other information relevant to customer surveys

The information you provide will be used and retained in line with our Data Protection Policy which can be found via the college web site.

Use of Cookies

Cookies are small files of letters and numbers which are stored by your browser on your device, if you agree, and which help provide information:

- regarding the electronic device used by you and distinguish you from other users of our website.
- where appropriate, about your device in order to assist us in improving our website and in order to provide you with a good experience when browsing our website
- about your general internet use

You can adjust the settings on your device to decline any optional cookies if you wish. This can easily be done by activating the reject cookies setting on your device.

Our website uses the following cookies:

- Strictly necessary cookies. These are cookies that are required for the operation of our website. These essential cookies are always enabled because our website won't work properly without them. They include, for example, cookies that enable you to log into secure areas of our website, such as our student, staff and parent portals.
- Analytical or performance cookies. These allow us to recognise and count the number of visitors and to see how visitors move around our website when they are using it. This helps us to improve the way our website works, for example, by ensuring that users are finding what they are looking for easily.
- **Functionality cookies.** These are used to recognise you when you return to our website. This enables us to personalise our content for you, and remember your preferences (for example, your choice of language or region).
- **Targeting cookies.** These cookies record your visit to our website, the pages you have visited and the links you have followed. This information may be used by other websites for advertising.
