#### PREPARATION TASKS

Practice your instrument/voice! You will be asked to perform a piece at an audition during enrolment, so now if the perfect time to spend developing your performance skills and/or learning new repertoire. You could download a free app (like A Capella), to practice playing along with yourself.

Write some music. You could write some music to reflect what's happening in the world at the moment, either from your own personal perspective, or as some kind of reaction to what others are going through. For example some music to express thanks to the NHS. Some of the composing software you might be familiar with at school is being offered for free at the moment.

### RESEARCH

Development of the Symphony: Research and listen to the symphonies of Johann Stamitz and Joseph Haydn - they wrote over 150 between them! Research what their most well-known symphonies are and how their styles changed over time and how they infuenced other composers.

Musical Theatre. We will be studying musicals by 6 composers: Richard Rodgers, Leonard Bernstein, Stephen Sondheim, Claude Michel Schonberg, Andrew Lloyd Webber and Stephen Schwartz. Research which are their most famous musicals/songs and which ones you have heard of and might even have performed. Find a song from ones of these and learn to play or sing it. Many of these musicals are being streamed at the moment too.
